UK Acromegaly Register Update

There are currently 3295 patients on the register as detailed in the table, which is an overall increase of 109 patients in the past 8 months since the last newsletter! The major task for the remainder of 2014 will be continuing to update these records and to continue with the centralised blood measurements.

Ethics - Reminder

Patient consent - When consenting patients please ensure the PC number for the patient is entered at the top of the consent form. The PC number is the number generated by the database when a patient is added to the register. When consenting a patient either in clinic or by post, four copies of the consent form are required, one for the patient, one for the patient's notes, one for the chief investigator and one for the local site file. Please send the chief investigator's copy to Natasha Archer at the Society.

The project is a UK Clinical Research Network adopted study (ID 6687). As an adopted study we are required to submit accrual data to NIHR as a measure of research activity, for funding to local networks.
