



## NOGG seeks volunteers to join the committee

The National Osteoporosis Guideline Group committee is looking for new membership. We are specifically seeking volunteers with the following expertise:

**1. PRACTISING SECONDARY CARE PHYSICIANS**

This includes rheumatology, endocrinology, geriatric medicine, gynaecology, clinical chemistry, orthopaedic surgery, or any practising physician with a specialist interest in metabolic bone disease.

**2. PRACTISING NURSES AND ALLIED HEALTH PROFESSIONALS**

This includes osteoporosis specialist nurses and bone density technicians/ clinical scientists/ radiographers with expertise in performing DXAs and running a DXA service.

**3. NEW RHEUMATOLOGY SPECIALIST TRAINEE ROLE**

NOGG is creating a new position for a rheumatology specialist trainee for up to three years (which can include a maximum of 18 months at consultant level) who will contribute to NOGG as below and assist the chair in terms of administration.

Duties of NOGG committee members:

- To contribute to guideline updates, consultation documents and statements, as agreed with the Chair
- To be willing to present on the NOGG guideline at professional meetings if needed, as agreed with the Chair
- To respond to [info@nogg.org.uk](mailto:info@nogg.org.uk) email enquiries, if asked by the Chair
- To attend NOGG committee meetings (usually twice a year)
- To be an ambassador for NOGG within your professional societies

Representation from Wales, Scotland, Northern Ireland and England is needed.
